- 1. Were you able to experience Christ in the Passover on Sunday? What were your takeaways?
- 2. Our study of the Passover and Exodus allows us to look ahead to Good Friday and Easter. How has Christ in the Passover influenced your understanding and study of Exodus?
- 3. Exodus 1:15-22 sets the context for Moses' birth. As we shared about the experiences of the Hebrew people and the birth of their children, does this change how you read Exodus 2:1-10?
- 4. Let's reread Exodus 1:22 and Exodus 2:1-10 once more. Describe the significance of Moses being cast into the Nile by his mother and drawn out of the water by Pharaoh's daughter. What does this mean about God's sovereignty and providence?
- 5. Every person has flaws. Every leader has flaws. Exodus 2:11-15 separates Moses from the Egyptians and the Israelites. What are your thoughts about these encounters? About Moses?
- 6. What do we learn about Moses, his character, and his responses in Exodus 2:16-22?
- 7. What people and experiences did God use to equip Moses? What in your life might God use to equip you?
- 8. How was Moses transformed from a compassionate but impetuous leader into one called "the meekest man on earth"?
- 9. Exodus 2:23-25 is an incredible section of Scripture. How does this impact the remaining chapters of the book of Exodus? What does this mean for you?
- 10. In Exodus 2:24-25, God sees, God hears, and God remembers. God still does today. How can we pray for one another today?
