

Sermon Title: Deliver: God Remembers Scripture: Exodus 2-3 Date: February 11th, 2023 Speaker Name: Justin Chandler

- 1. Note: if you did not cover Exodus 2 in your discussion last week, please use the previous discussion questions in connection with this week's message.
- 2. Let's read Exodus 2:23-25 from last week. How does God's call of Moses in Genesis 3 relate to these verses?
- 3. How does Exodus 3:7-12 reveal how God sees, hears, knows, and remembers His people?
- 4. Considering the scope of what Israel was experiencing, why was Moses God's answer? As you reflect on the scope of what you may be experiencing, how do you think God would answer? Who do you think God would send?
- 5. Are there people in your life whom God may be calling YOU to be Moses to? Would it require a burning bush moment for you to say yes? Why or why not?
- 6. Notice Moses' response to God in Exodus 3:6. Why is this the response of every person who sees God for the first time? How does this influence how you view God? Worship?
- 7. Exodus 3:13-14 is of monumental significance. What is your understanding of this verse? What have you learned? Who have you learned it from?
- 8. Take note of how many times God says, "*I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob*" in Exodus 3. Why is this phrase repeated so many times?
- 9. During the Seder Meal, one drop is spilled for each of the 10 Plagues of Egypt; the joy that Israel experienced is tangibly diminished because of what occurred to the Egyptians. How does this change your view of God, the Hebrews, the Egyptians, and the Exodus?
- 10. Exodus 3:19-20 says that God also knows the king of Egypt. What does that mean for you and I and others in our life?
