- 1. Why was it important for God to remind Moses in Exodus 6:2-4? What significance does this carry for Moses so far and in the days to come?
- 2. What encouragement does God offer Moses in 6:5? How might this encouragement apply to a Christian under pressure today?
- 3. Why was it important for the people of Israel to be reminded in Exodus 6:6-8? The book of Exodus reveals God and His character to Moses and the Israelites as much as it does to Pharaoh and Egypt. What is this generation of Hebrews hearing for the first time?
- 4. Let's read Exodus 6:9 together. Why did the people of Israel respond this way? When has this been true for you?
- 5. Exodus 6:2-8 reveals who God is. Exodus 6:14-27 reveals who Moses and Aaron are. What do these two sections have in common? Why would future generations need to know these two sections?
- 6. The generations of the genealogy of Exodus 6:14-27 never left Egypt and did not see a promise fulfilled. What can learn about faith and faithfulness from them, especially given their inclusion in Scripture?
- 7. Moses says in Exodus 6:12 and 6:30, "I am of uncircumcised lips." What does this mean? Why does that matter when Moses speaks to Pharaoh?
- 8. Exodus 7:7 reveals the ages of Moses and Aaron. How does this change a perception you may have had about the book of Exodus?
- 9. Exodus 7:8-13 describes the first conflict between Pharaoh, Egyptian magicians, Moses, and Aaron. What occurs? Why?
