- 1. Were you able to attend Good Friday and Easter Sunday services at Harbor Trinity? What was your experience?
- 2. In Exodus 13:18, parents are instructed to tell their children, "It is because of what the Lord did for me when I came out of Egypt," as they celebrated The Feast of Unleavened Bread. How do you remember and share what God has done for you?
- 3. Good Friday is the day when Christians remember what Christ did as He bore our sins, stood in our place, and laid down His life on our behalf. What similarities exist between the first Passover instituted as Israel was liberated in Egypt and Good Friday for Christians?
- 4. Charles Kingsley said, "There are two freedoms—the false, where a man is free to do what he likes; and the true, where a man is free to do what he ought." Why is the first of these false and the other true?
- 5. How would things be different in our society if people pursued true freedom instead of the false kind?
- 6. The Israelites were saved from bondage in Egypt to freedom in the Promised Land. What are you saved from, and what are you saved to?
- 7. How did God visibly guide the Israelites to the Red Sea? How does God guide believers today?
- 8. Exodus 14:30-31 says, "Thus the Lord saved Israel that day from the hand of the Egyptians, and Israel saw the Egyptians dead on the seashore." This is a powerful visual for a people liberated from slavery. How does this relate to what Christ has accomplished for us?
- 9. As we finish our series on the opening portion of the book of Exodus, what has been the most impactful to you?
