- 1. What comes to your mind when you hear the word "trinity"?
- 2. How would you explain The Trinity to someone who had never heard the term before?
- 3. What has been the most helpful analogy or description of The Trinity for you?
- 4. Are there any analogies or descriptions of The Trinity that you have used in the past that you no longer use? If so, why?
- 5. Let's read the passages listed above. How does each of each of them distinctly show The Trinity? What can we learn about The Trinity from them together?
- 6. Have you ever thought, as A.W. Tozer states, that "God cannot so divide Himself that one Person works while another is inactive. In the Scriptures the three Persons are sown to act in harmonious unity in all the mighty works that are wrought throughout the universe."? Why is this necessary in our understanding of The Trinity?
- 7. A common misconception of The Trinity is that God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit talk with one another and decide courses of action. Why is this helpful for our understanding but ultimately inaccurate? What does this mean about the unity of God?
- 8. How familiar are you with the creeds? Is there one that you have heard or know most about?
- 9. Why are the creeds important? Why do they continue to serve a purpose to Christians across the globe today?
- 10. Why are the prayers of Paul (2 Corinthians 13:14) and Peter (1 Peter 1:1-2) important to our understanding of The Trinity? While the term "Trinity" does not appear in the Bible, what do these prayers affirm?
