- 1. How familiar are you with Peter the Apostle? Are there aspects of his story that are most memorable to you?
- 2. Have you been able to read 1 Peter before? If so, are there verses or passages that are meaningful to you? If so, why?
- 3. Read 1 Peter 1:1 and 5:12–14. What do we know about the author of this book? (See also John 1:35–42; 21:15–17; Acts 4:13; and Gal. 2:1–10.)
- 4. What is significant about Peter calling his readers "exiles" and "the Dispersion"? Why might he have called them that?
- 5. How are we "exiles" today?
- 6. Do you think of yourself as a "exile"? How do you think Peter expects that to affect the ways you think and act?
- 7. Peter wrote this letter from "Babylon" (1 Peter 5:13), by which he probably meant Rome. What do you think he meant by calling Rome "Babylon"? What is significant about his location?
- 8. "According to the foreknowledge of God the Father, in the sanctification of the Spirit, for obedience to Jesus Christ and for sprinkling with his blood" (1 Peter 1:1). In your own words, what does each of these statements about the three members of the Trinity mean?
- 9. How would you define grace? How do you define peace? How may it be multiplied to you? Why is this an effective prayer at all times for all people?
- 10. Peter refers to suffering at least fifteen times in this letter. Quickly skim this letter to find out why the recipients were suffering. How is God's grace related to suffering?
