- 1. Who is the best person you have worked for? Who is the worst? What distinguishes the two from each other?
- 2. What do you think of when you hear the word submission? Why?
- 3. Let's read 1 Peter 2:13-15. In the fall we studied the book of Daniel in our series, Kingdoms & Kings. How are Daniel and his three friends good illustrations of how to live these verses?
- 4. Peter has personal experience with governing authorities in Acts 4:1-22 and Acts 5:17-42. How do each of these reflect "be subject for the Lord's sake to every human institution" (1 Peter 2:13) and "we must obey God rather than men" (Acts 5:29)?
- 5. In light of this, what then should submission to authority look like to you?
- 6. What is our responsibility to government leaders (our emperors and governors) whom we don't always agree with based upon this passage (not personal opinion or previous perspective)?
- 7. How does the Christian response to authority in this area "put to silence the ignorance of foolish people" (1 Peter 2:15) and "keep your conduct among the Gentiles honorable" (1 Peter 2:12)?
- 8. Are there any areas where "the ignorance of foolish people" is being used to describe Christians? Are there any areas where the general Christian response is ignorant and/or foolish?
- 9. How is it possible to "use your freedom as a cover-up for evil" (1 Peter 2:16)? Have you ever known someone (maybe yourself) who has justified their behavior because of the grace, mercy, and forgiveness of God? Why does Peter speak against this?
- 10. Peter gives a four part application to end this section in 1 Peter 2:17. (1) Honor everyone. (2) Love the brotherhood. (3) Fear God. (4) Honor the emperor. How are you encouraged and challenged to respond?
