- 1. Worship can often mean many things? Prior to this weekend have you defined worship?
- 2. If worship is "how we respond to what we love most," where have you seen your "greatest" worship?
- 3. Do you find that how you respond to God (in church or otherwise) is different from how you respond to other things in life? Why is that?
- 4. What has received the greatest response in your life? Why? Could you ever see that same response being given to God? Why or why not?
- 5. Hebrews 10:24-25 expands the meaning of worship from an individual expression to a corporate response. Why is this an important understanding of worship?
- 6. One of the applications of this verse is to, "not neglect meeting together, as is the habit of some." Do you know anyone who has left the church (in general, or specific to Harbor Trinity) but continues to believe in Jesus? Without naming names, how would they respond to Hebrews 10:24-25? How could you encourage them to return?
- 7. The author of Hebrews encourages readers to stir one another to love and good works and to encourage one another. How have you experienced worship in this way?
- 8. The author and worship leader, Bob Kauflin, states, "Edification and worship are different sides of the same coin." Have you considered our response to others as a direct reflection of how we respond to God?
- 9. Would it be possible to have a correct worship of God and an incorrect response to others? Why or why not?
- 10. One of the motivations for worship is "as you see the Day drawing near." Stephen Covey says that one of the habits of highly effective people is to "begin with the end in mind." How does our understanding of "the end" influence how we worship today?
