- 4. Read Acts 5:17-32. How did the high priest and Sadducees respond to God's truth? Why?
- 5. What did putting the apostles in jail do to the truth of the statements (Acts 5:17-26)?
- 6. How did Peter and the others affirm the truth of God's Word?
- 7. What consequences did they suffer for truth or truthfulness?
- 8. Read Acts 5:33–42. What pros and cons do you perceive from Gamaliel's approach to this situation? Are you able to utilize this response in other circumstances within your life?
- 9. How did persecution affect the apostles and the church? Why?
- 10. How does the response of the apostles and the early church to persecution differ from the response of the American church?
- 11. "And every day, in the temple and from house to house, they did not cease teaching and preaching that the Christ is Jesus" (Acts 5:42). How can we do the same this week? Is there anyone in particular you feel led to share with?
