Sermon Title: The Greats: Great Commission

Scripture: Matthew 28:16-20; Mark 16:14-20; Acts 1:6-11

1. How familiar are you with the word “commission”? How do you use it most often?
2. Do you have a frame of reference for the Great Commission found in Matthew 28:16-20, Mark 16:14-18, and Acts 1:6-8? Is there a particular passage or translation you are most familiar with?
3. Let’s take a moment to read Matthew 28:16-20, Mark 16:14-20, and Acts 1:6-11 together. What observations do you have on the similarities and differences of each passage?
4. Justin shared this weekend, “A commission is not a suggestion.” If you are a disciple of Jesus, how are you living as a disciple maker? If you are not making disciples, why?
5. At this point in our conversation, it is important to define what a disciple is. How would you define a disciple?
6. We are all discipling someone to something. As you consider how the things you say and do are being multiplied in others, what do you see about yourself in others most?
7. After His resurrection, Jesus rebuked His disciples “for their unbelief and hardness of heart” (Mark 16:14). “When they saw him they worshipped him, but some doubted” (Matthew 28:17). Do you believe there is space for your doubts, hardness of heart, and unbelief? Why or why not? If it was possible for the disciples, surely there is space for us as well?
8. Jesus promised His disciples that they would be filled with the Holy Spirit, signs will accompany those who believe, and they teach the nations to observe all that He said and did. Based upon Scripture, do you believe this is true for you? Why or why not?
9. As you consider your personal Jerusalem (local), Judea and Samaria (regional), and to the end of the earth (global) call to be a disciple maker, where is Jesus inviting you to “go”?
10. One of the greatest promises of Jesus is, “And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age” (Matthew 28:20). Despite what you may be experiencing, do you believe that Jesus is with you today? If He is with you, then who or what can stand against you?
