## *Discussion Questions*

**Sermon Title:** The Greats: Great Collaboration

**Scripture:** John 17:20-26

**Date:** January 25th, 2026

1. In your opinion, what is the greatest team of all time? Why?
2. John 17 is “The High Priestly Prayer.” Who is Jesus praying for during these verses? Why?
3. The High Priestly Prayer is part of a larger portion of the Gospel of John known as the Farewell Discourse (John 13-17). What topics does Jesus cover (looking at the titles of each section will suffice)?
4. How significant is it that the Farewell Discourse, including the High Priestly Prayer occur immediately after the Last Supper?
5. Which of Jesus’ requests for His disciples (John 17:6-26) seems especially significant for you? Why?
6. Our focus this weekend was upon John 17:20-26, “those who will believe in me through their word.” This includes every believer from the disciples until today, including us. What does the global and historic magnitude of this mean to you?
7. What did Jesus pray for those who were to come? Why was this such a priority for Him?
8. Jesus prayed that His followers “may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you” (John 17:21). Is this how you would describe Christians today? Globally? Denominationally? In the United States? Within Harbor Trinity?
9. How can believers demonstrate true unity?
10. How does this prayer, in John 17, suggest we can share in Jesus’ overcoming of the world?
11. How is Jesus inviting you to pursue unity with other believers? Is there a particular person you need to reconcile with? An area of ministry you need to step in and serve?
12. The most important way we can end our time is to pray. To pray for unity with one another in this group. To pray for unity within our church. To pray for unity amongst the churches of Costa Mesa. To pray for unity for the broader Church. “That [we] may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that [the Father] sent [the Son] and loved [us] even as [the Father] loved [the Son]” (John 17:23). So be it.
