Sermon Title: I Am: The Way, the Truth, and the Life

Scripture: John 14:1-14

1. What are some things that trouble you? Why?
2. Let's read John 13:36-14:1. What troubled the disciples? Why?
3. Throughout our series, we have considered the words of Jesus and His claims to be God. What does Jesus mean by the statement, "Believe in God; believe also in me" (John 14:1)?
4. Why did Jesus begin to speak about heaven to address the troubled hearts of His disciples?
5. How did Jesus make heaven real to the disciples?
6. Does looking forward to heaven help to calm you when you are troubled? Why or why not?
7. Thomas said to Jesus, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" (John 14:5). Do you ever feel this way? Does this describe your experiences with faith?
8. Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life" (John 14:6). This is a similar expression that Jesus made when He said, "I am the door" (John 10:1-10). Why does the exclusivity of Jesus matter?
9. What does Jesus mean when He says, I am the way, I am the truth, and I am the life? Let's define each term separately and then discuss what they mean together.
10. Thomas believed "the way" was a direction or destination. Jesus revealed "the way" is a person (Himself). How do you understand this distinction?
11. Jesus told His disciples, "whoever believes in me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will he do, because I am going to the Father" (John 14:12). What does Jesus mean by greater works? How has this been true in your life?
12. Jesus promised, "If you ask anything in my name, I will do it" (John 14:14). What does Jesus mean when He says, "anything"? Do you believe what He says? How have your prayers and your life been a reflection of this belief?
