1. If worship is “how we respond to what we love most,” how do you respond to God most often?
2. Psalm 100 invites “all the earth” to worship. How often do you consider that the worship of Jesus is not just a Western or modern concept, but is global and historic?
3. “Make a joyful noise” (Psalm 100:1) is often used as a playful invitation for those with limited vocal or music ability. While lightheartened and fun, do you believe this is the intent?
4. Why must worship make “noise”? Our responses cannot purely be thoughtful or intellectual, it must spill out into actions, right?
5. Do you believe that everything you do is worship? Would you describe everything you do as “serving the LORD with gladness” (Psalm 100:2)?
6. Another place we consider “serving the LORD” is within our local church community. How have you been able to serve within Harbor Trinity? Are there opportunities the LORD is inviting you into, or that you are prayerful considering?
7. Why is it important to remember that (1) He is God, (2) He made us, and (3) we are His? How can this serve as a reminder when we begin to doubt it?
8. One of the ways we doubt that “He has made us” is in how we look, how we are gifted, what we have been given, etc. This often comes when we compare ourselves to others or when we compare what we do not have. Can we take a moment to prayerfully remind ourselves of the promises of Psalm 100:3?
9. How has the LORD shown His goodness to you?
10. In what specific ways will you respond to His goodness?
11. As we prepare for the final month of our summer series, are there ways that you are noticing your thoughts on worship and responses differing? If so, what changes have you noticed? How have they integrated into your life?
